Steps

1. Set-up and invite

- Staff picks date, topic, region (local or national), etc
- Invitations and notices go out
- Participants sign-up, complete survey

Steps

2. Hold the event

- Congressman and introduction
- Break-out into diverse groups (4-6) for
 structured, self-facilitated conversations
 - Questions/ comments from groups


Builds Trust in Elected Officials

3. Analyze data and follow-up

- Detailed reports with natural language analysis, constituent feedback, normalized surveys
- Follow-up with all participants
